Here is an overview of what is to come:

## English

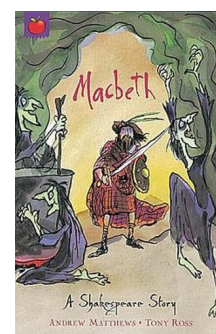
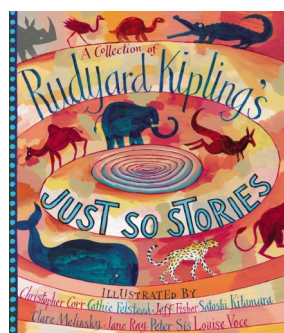
Our first piece of writing will be inspired by the '**Just So Stories**' by Rudyard Kipling and children will write their own origin story for an animal of their choice.

Next, we will learn about the life of David Attenborough and will use what we find out to write a **biography**.

Our last writing focus will introduce the class to William Shakespeare's **Macbeth**.

## Maths

After SATs, the class will be learning to apply a range of maths skills in some project-based learning which will include using spreadsheets and calculating income.



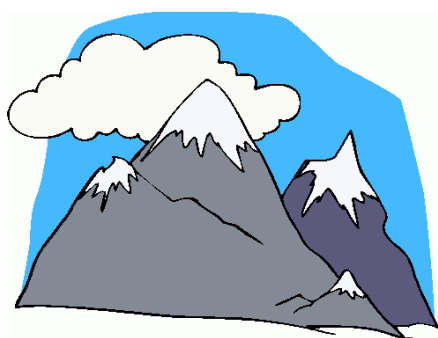
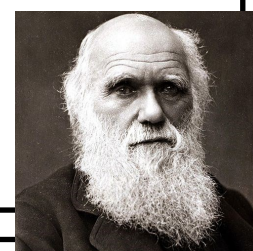
## Topic

**Living Things and their habitats**– Children will learn about the life cycles of different animals; about the reproduction of plants and animals and how living things are classified by observing characteristics.

**Evolution and Inheritance**- This topic will focus on providing an understanding of the scientific theories of evolution and adaptation and will look at how living things pass characteristics on to their offspring through inheritance.

**The Role of Women**– This short history topic will draw on children's learning of different time periods to track the changing role that women have held in society.

**Mountains**– Children will use map skills to locate mountains around the world and will learn about how mountains are formed. To accompany our trip to Crowden, we will study the Pennine mountains and make comparisons to our local environment.



## PE

Our PE lessons will continue to be on a Wednesday and a Friday each week. Please ensure that your child is in correct PE kit on these days and that they have both indoor and outdoor shoes available. Children should be in correct school uniform for the rest of the week.

## Crowden

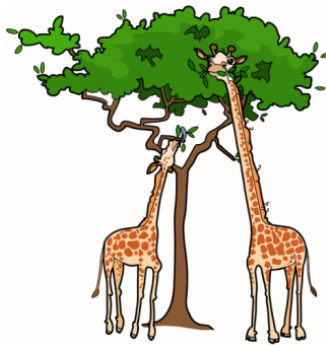
Our residential Trip to Crowden is fast approaching. We will be sending out a kit list and holding a short meeting after school on Tuesday 23rd May.
